Press Release

On June 15, 2018, a narcotics search warrant was executed at 3544 Stampley Rd after a joint investigation by the Adams County Sheriff's Office, Jefferson County Sheriff's Office, and Mississippi Bureau of Narcotics. Borris Ward, who was inside the trailer at the time the search warrant was executed, was arrested on two counts of Sale of Sch II Drug (methamphetamine).

As officers searched the property, they opened the trunk of a Dodge Charger (which Ward had the keys to in his pocket) and discovered a cache of weapons, approximately 1.1 pounds of methamphetamine and a small amount of marijuana. A Lorcin .380 (reported Stolen), a Smith and Wesson 357 revolver, CZ P-09 9mm (reported stolen), FNS 40S&W, Berretta 9mm, Sterling Mark Arms 380, Ruger P-95, Heritage .22 (reported stolen), Hi Point 40 S&W rifle (reported stolen), Century International 7.62 (reported stolen) were found wrapped in blankets under the methamphetamine.

Ward is a convicted felon and is not allowed to be in possession of any weapons. Alcohol Tobacco and Firearms asked officer to submit the reports and will they would present the case the United States Attorney's Office for prosecution.

On February 21, 2019, a federal grand jury returned a Sealed Indictment for Boris Ward. On March 13, 2019, the US Marshal's Service came and transported Boris Ward to the Madison County Jail until he can be arraigned by a Federal Magistrate on the charges in the Indictment on March 18, 2019. Sheriff Patten said that he hoped Boris is just the first person from a list of people that has been submitted to Alcohol Tobacco and Firearms for prosecution. The Adams County Special Operations Group is working with every agency that it can on both the local level and the federal level. We are using every resource that we have available and will continue
